



## **“Shrink Wrap Assessment” Contest Rules & Regulations**

1. The “Shrink Wrap” Contest is open to companies in Quebec and Ontario Canada who submit their name to have an assessment done on their shrink wrap equipment (the “Entry”) during the term of this Contest. One entry per company.
2. Contest runs March 1, 2009 9:00 a.m. ET to April 30<sup>th</sup>, 2009 5:00 p.m. ET. There will be one (1) prize draw for a XBOX 360 game console (approximate retail value \$300.00).
3. No purchase necessary. To enter the contest without submitting an Entry, please send a 200 word essay to Unisource on your ideas for protecting the environment. Mail the letter to “Shrink Wrap Assessment” Contest at 50 East Wilmot Street, Richmond Hill, Ontario, L4B 3Z3. The entry must be received prior to April 30<sup>th</sup>, 2009, 5:00 p.m. ET to be eligible for the draw.
4. Selected entrant must correctly answer a mathematical skill testing question before being declared a winner.
5. The draw will take place on May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2009 at noon at Unisource Canada, Inc.’s National Head office, 50 East Wilmot Street, Richmond Hill, Ontario, L4B 3Z3. Unisource shall select the potential winner from all eligible Entries by random draw. Odds of winning depend on number of eligible Entries received. 6. All entrants must be 18 + years of age and a resident of Ontario or Quebec. Employees, agents and representatives of Unisource and its affiliated companies and all persons with whom any of the former are domiciled are not eligible.
7. Selected entrant will be contacted by Unisource following the draw. If Unisource is unable to contact the selected entrant within 30 days of the draw then he/she will not be eligible and an alternate entrant will be randomly selected.

In order to be declared a winner, in addition to answering the skill testing question, the selected entrant must sign and return a standard declaration and release form confirming compliance with the rules, acceptance of the prize as awarded, authorizing the use of his/her name in any publicity associated with the contest and releasing Unisource and its affiliates from all liability. Prize will be delivered to confirmed winner within 6-8 weeks of being declared a winner.
9. Prize must be accepted as awarded and cannot be transferred to cash.
